LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The 2009 NY State legislative year seems as if it will never end! Unfortunately, the State's fiscal crisis is taking a disproportionate effect on the State's support of library activities. Our systems (NLS, SCLS, LILRC, and the school library systems (Nassau, Eastern and Western Suffolk) have not received all the funding that they were promised in April and additional cuts in aid may be made even as the year comes to an end. This is an

unconscionable situation! We strongly urge members to contact their state legislators and indicate disapproval of the way that our systems have been treated. Note that State funding for libraries is now at a level that approximates support in 1998!

Work on a 2010 legislative priority package is being completed by NYLA's Legislative Committee. I am sure that the package contains elements for each component of the library community and will seek to restore the support of previous years.

We remind our members that the 2010 Library Legislative Day event in Albany will take place on Tuesday, March 2, 2010. NCLA will be providing busses and refreshments for those stalwart folks who make this annual trip to demonstrate our commitment and support of library service in NY State. Put this date on your calendar and make sure that you are counted in our contingent.

The October meeting was a special Breakfast Meeting on Tuesday, October 13, 2009, at 9:30am to 12noon at NLS and covered "Everything You Wanted to Know About Poetry." RASD and the PR/Programming Division co-sponsored this program on poetry collection development and promotion.

The speaker was Marsha Howard from Poets House. Gayl Teller, the Nassau County Poet Laureate briefly spoke about her vision of poetry and programs that she does.

To promote poetry, Ms. Howard suggested live poetry events where poets read their own work or that of others, writing workshops for adults and teens, a poetry display, collection development, and using personal relationships with patrons and community to bring people together (special topics such as 9/11 or forgiveness).

Their website is www.poetshouse.org and a recommended book is "Poetry in the Branches" sourcebook. Marsha Howard also has a list of recommended poetry books for your collection, both classic and new poetry.

We hosted "Mind Massage...a stress management strategy" given by Mona Gulino and Dr. Joseph Criscuoli on Tuesday, November 10, 2009, at 9:30am at NLS. This PowerPoint presentation, with interactive exercises

provided practical strategies to help reduce stress and enhance mental focus. We learned a new breathing technique to immediately reduce stress among other relaxation techniques.

Our last meeting of the year was a "Holiday Tea" on Monday, December 14, 2009, at 9:30am at the Baldwin Public Library. In the past, some libraries have contacted me and wondered how they could have a cooking program without a kitchen. NCLA should have sent out the annual membership renewal notices by the time you receive this Newsletter, however, you are welcome to use the form that is on the back of the Newsletter to provide us with your information as you send in your check for the 2010 Membership Year. The NCLA Executive Board has chosen to retain the membership dues at the 2007 rates. We are hopeful that by retaining dues as low as possible, while still providing the fiscal resources to fund the many NCLA activities, we can make sure that our membership levels remain at their high levels.

As we prepare to close the 2009 Membership year, our campaign has been productive. However, it has not reached the levels of our 2005 record-setting membership year. Unfortunately, it appears that we will not reach our target of 1000 returning and new members. As I prepare this report, our membership stands at 949 active members. 

NCLA MEDIA SERVICES DIVISION UPDATE

On December 8, 2009, the Media Services Division held its Annual Luncheon and Installation of Officers at the Lynbrook Public Library. The theme of the program was "Documentary Films in Libraries: Valuable But Overlooked," featuring presentations from two documentary filmmakers, Yale Nelson and Maria Pusitera.

Yale Nelson, an Emmy Award winning editor with over 25 years of professional experience, spoke about "Incredible Journey: The Story of West Hampton Dunes," which chronicles the Long Island beachfront community's restoration efforts. Maria Pusateri, an award-winning director/producer and founder of DreamSlate Productions, talked about "Vito After," the story of Vito Friscia, a Brooklyn homicide detective who survived and bravely helped others on 9/11.

Library Briefs




