

This symposium is about re-imagining the current and future role of libraries and people who work in libraries. As a participant, you will be:





Opening day for Teens and Tots Storytime at the Garden City pool was Tuesday, June 30, 2009. This program, which is coordinated every summer by Marge Kelly, *Garden City Public Library's* young adult librarian, took place every Tuesday and Wednesday until August 5th. Young adult volunteers attended training sessions at the library during the year to help them select books and prepare activities for the countless children who participated in this summer program.



The Merrick Library has been approved by the New York Council for the Humanities to host a "Reading Between the Lines" program. The program consists of a series of four book discussions centering on the theme of "Tragedy and Loss in Four American Novels" and will run monthly from September to December 2009. Discussion books and payment to the moderator will be covered by the Council as part of the program. Head of Reference, Ellen Fannon, appreciates the Council's support and encourages other libraries to look into the many free programs which the N.Y. Council provides.

The Merrick Library, in cooperation with North Merrick Public Library, Bellmore Memorial Library, and North Bellmore Public Library, offered teens a "Beach Bag Book Club". The program centered around the colorful beach bags provided to each girl who joined the group, containing notepads, pens, goodies, and books they were going to read including selections by the authors that were coming to talk with the teens. Teen author Jen Calonita said, "I get a better turnout here than I get at Barnes & Noble". The girls got to meet the authors and participate in book discussions. Merrick Library's Teen Librarian Larissa Simonovski came up with the idea last summer and has expanded on it for this summer. In addition to Jen Calonita, authors include Sara Shepard (*Pretty Little Liar* series), and Claudia Gray (*Evernight* vampire series). The program was so popular, there is talk of extending it through the fall. The programs took place in the cozy parlor room of the Merrick Library Wing.



The Uniondale Public Library hosted a new traveling exhibition focusing on the life, accomplishments and legacy of Abraham Lincoln from July 17, 2009 through August 10, 2009.
