I know how much work goes into preparing for an event and appreciate all your hard work that certainly contributed toward its success.

NCLA MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

2011 With the now completed, we note that by the end of the year, NCLA's membership roster carried the names of 947 active members. Unfortunately, this was substantially below our record of 1038 members (2005). On the NCLA's total positive side, membership shows that we still rank among the top 15 library associations in the United States in total membership.

Among the highlights in our final membership report was fact that we encouraging future librarians to give NCLA a try as the number of student memberships reached а high of 40! Institutional membership was once again strong as 64 organizations of various types decided that they needed to belong to the Association. Children's Services, PR/Programming, and Young Adult Services continue to establish new high levels.

Our retired colleagues continue to maintain their presence in the Association as 94 individuals renewed their commitment to NCLA for the 2011 year – this exuberance was rewarded with the creation of a Retirees Committee which planned many events for this audience. The Reference and Adult Services Division continues to be the foundation of our efforts with 341 members, just slightly off its record level.

Your membership chair looks forward to a strong 2012 as our second largest division – the newly renamed Support Staff Division (formerly known as Clerical Services) – with Dalal Fatoush as an important champion, has promised that she will be active in our recruitment campaign.

Watch for reports highlighting our membership growth as we start off the 2012 Membership Campaign with 390 (1/12/12) individuals and organizations already joining or renewing their place in the Association.



Update from the NCLA Institutional Services Committee

For almost 10 years, the NCLA Institutional Services Committee has provided and services for resources students at Mercy First Syosset campus. This co-educational school provides "an integrated continuum of care" children who are in need. including those without families, or who suffer abuse, neglect, emotional problems, or live in poverty and can include children from families with stress, domestic violence, mental illness and substance abuse.

Last summer, the NCLA Institutional Services Committee Chair Amrita Madray (Adelphi University), with Mamie Ena (Valley Stream Henry Waldinger Memorial Library), planned a program to give these students hands-on interactive а experience that included information about animals from local farm. This event provided an outlet for these students who have an inordinate amount of stress in their daily lives.




