Award Criteria

We are basing the Mock Stonewall criteria on the following official award criteria.

Eligibility

"The Stonewall Book Awards of the American Library Association are given annually to English-language books of exceptional merit relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender experience. The awards are given to works published in the United States in the previous calendar year, although works published elsewhere may be considered."

Selection Criteria*

"The adult literature category encompasses novels, short stories, poetry, and drama. The adult nonfiction category includes biography, history, criticism, reference works, fine arts, and other traditional nonfiction genres. Anthologies comprised of both nonfiction and literary pieces will be categorized by whichever form predominates. The children's and young adult literature includes both fiction and non-fiction."

*Please note we have only two categories:

Adult and Youth.
